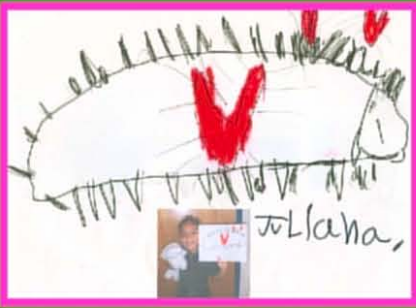
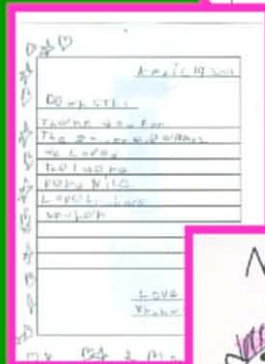
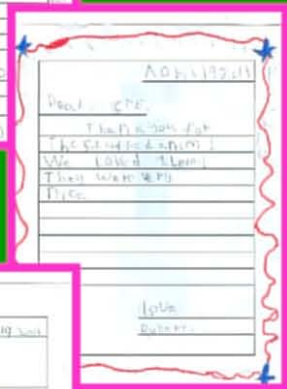
Project M.O.R.E.'s CTE (Career & Technological Education's) *Future Business Leaders of America (F.B.L.A.)* and the CTE Graphic Design *SkillsUSA* programs, with the direction of the Advisor, Ms. Kathryn Wilde, teamed up to facilitate several Community Service projects around Tucson and at Project M.O.R.E. The students and Mrs. Wilde conducted a Community Food Bank Food Drive during the month of November to collect and donate food for the families in need around the Holiday Season. Project M.O.R.E. managed to collect two boxes full of items to take to the food bank despite the hard economic times this era has been facing. It was a wonderful way for our Project M.O.R.E. staff and students to give back to our community.

We also managed to team up a second time to organize a Teddy Bear Collection to hand deliver to underprivileged children at Ochoa Elementary School nearby, in Tucson, AZ. The children were excited and more than thankful to receive the bears. The Ochoa students were so thankful they wrote thank you letters and drew pictures for the CTE *F.B.L.A.* and *SkillsUSA* students and staff.

Another Community Service project we participate in year-round, for the betterment of the school and community is our Recycling Program. All staff and students are encouraged to recycle throughout the school year filling designated recycling bins around campus. Once a week CTE *BMAS* and *SkillsUSA* classes circulate the school and collect all the recycling and take it out to the designated recycling receptacle, which gets picked up weekly by the City of Tucson's "Green & Beautiful" Recycling Pro-





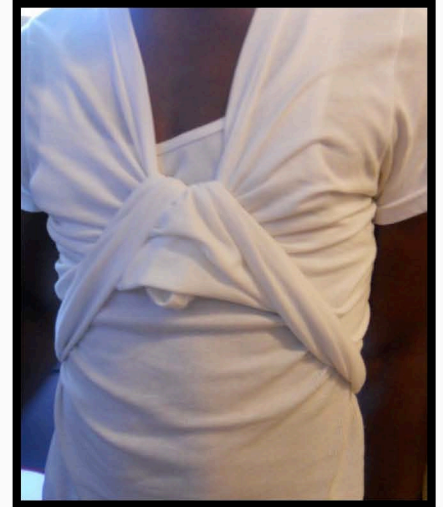
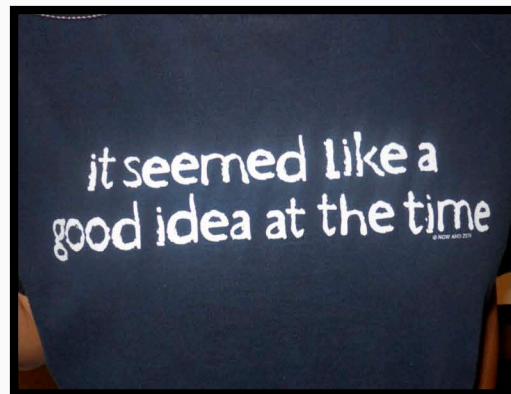
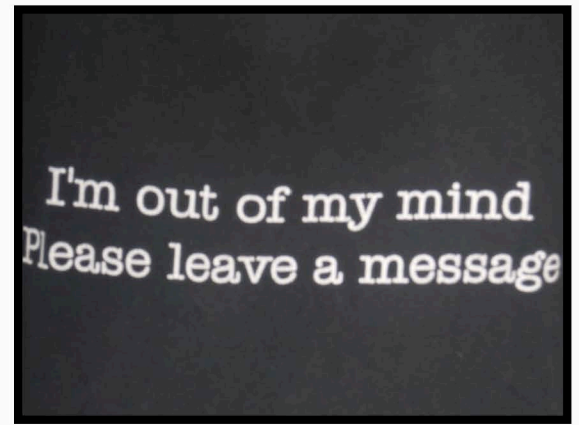
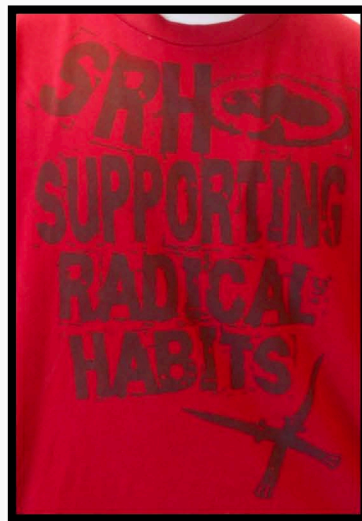
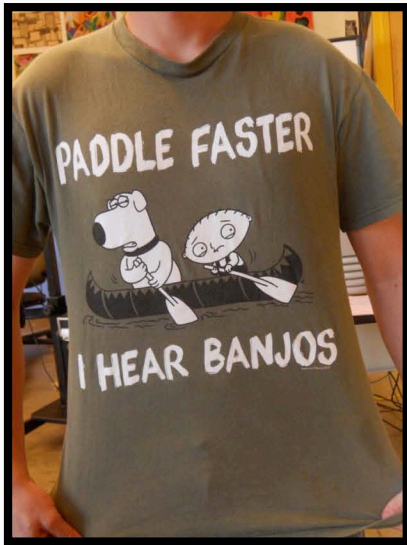




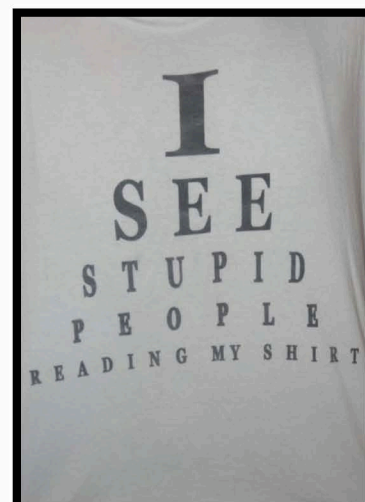
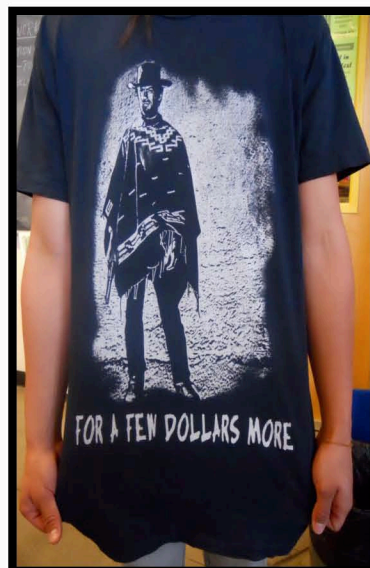
