

Student Empowerment By Principal, Robert Mackay

This spring Project M.O.R.E. students were faced with a crisis. A proposal to declare Project M.O.R.E. a "New School" was presented by the TUSD Administration. This proposal required that all teachers needed to re-apply for their jobs and there was a risk the school would lose a number of the current staff. This was unacceptable to the student body, so the students jumped into action. Students started with a petition to stop the New School process and this petition was signed by almost every student. Next the students sent emails, wrote letters, and helped organize a "Friends of Alternative Education" group which included their parents, relatives and friends. All this culminated at a rally at a TUSD School Board meeting which was attended by hundreds of supporters of Alternative Education. The "Friends" made and waved signs, sang songs and delivered speeches.

THE STUDENTS WON!!!!!!!!

The School Board relented and kept all the teachers. This was a clear and poignant example of the power of the Project M.O.R.E. students. Next year the school will begin a Transformation process designed to improve the school. Educational experts from all over are going to come in and make recommendations on how to change Project M.O.R.E. But the most important voices— the students voices— are the ones that really must be heard. Students need to be involved in all major decisions (hiring, schedules, curriculum, discipline, and more), and this involvement must be meaningful. Students deserve a vote. They've earned this right.



Our students made every teacher and administrator in the room proud. Real proud. They asked the Board to keep the staff at Project M.O.R.E. intact. They asked the Board to keep Project M.O.R.E. intact. At the time of this Yearbook printing we don't have all the answers, yet we know that the TUSD Board did listen and did hear what our students said. The story will continue to unravel and we are all hoping that Alternative Education will have the freedom to continue to thrive and meet the needs of our diverse population of students who collectively "dance to a different drummer." Give us the chance to continue to thrive and we won't let you down!


Kathryn's Glass-blowing Art Class

This year Project M.O.R.E. had a great opportunity in the arts. We were the recipients of a sizable grant that SGAA and Kathryn wrote to attend a glass-blowing class at the Sonoran Glass Art Academy. Our students were given the choice of working in the "torch room" making small pieces of beads, jewelry human figures, pendants, flowers, or anything their imagination and increased experience led them, or the "hot room." In the hot room (great name for it) since the room had one melted glass furnace for dipping into to gather glass, and two furnaces to keep their glass hot while working their pieces once their glass was taking shape. It was hot unless we were sitting under the cooler breeze.

We were fortunate to receive the grant and the support to practice an art form new to all of us.















































































