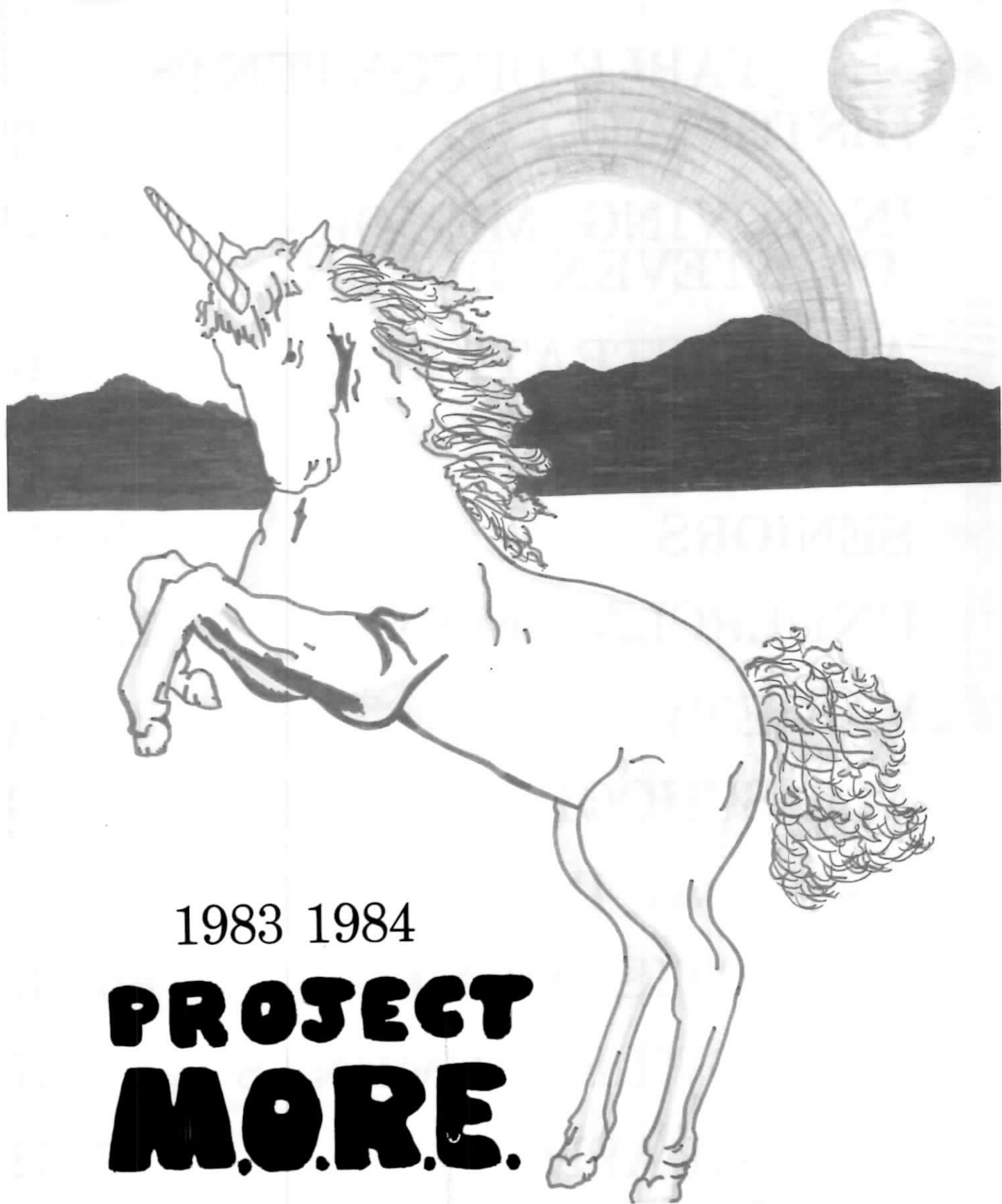

Project M.O.R.E. is a high school alternative education program. It has been a part of the Tucson Unified District #1 for eleven (11) years.

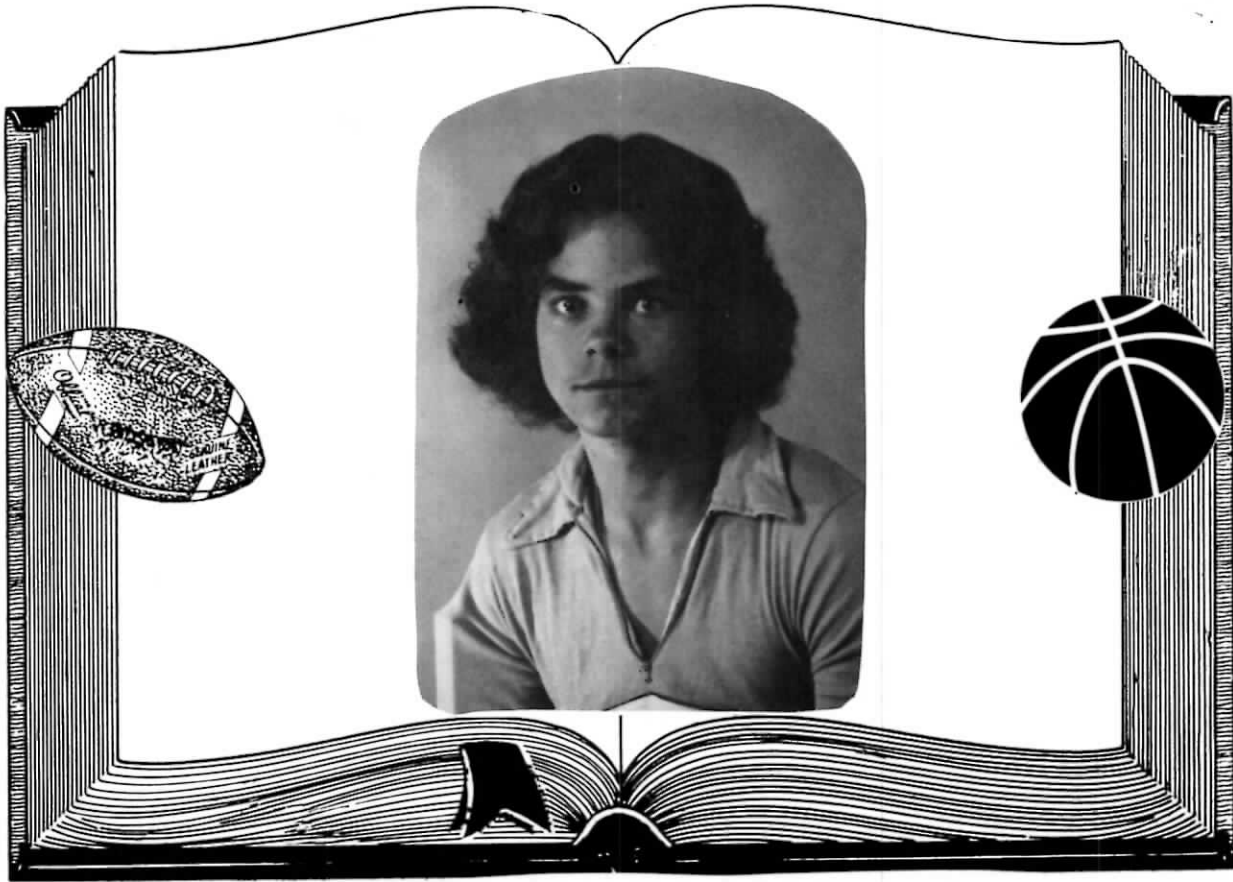
In January, 1973, Project M.O.R.E. was officially opened as a high school at Blenman Elementary School. In 1973 between January and June, Project M.O.R.E. had had twenty-four (24) senior graduates. During the '73-'74 school year, Project M.O.R.E. raised its enrollment to one hundred (100) students. The district moved the site to Lineweaver Elementary School.

While still at Lineweaver Elementary School during the '74-'75 school year, Project M.O.R.E. once again raised the enrollment to two hundred (200) students.

In '75-'76 Project M.O.R.E. had moved to Randolph Park for a short time. A few months after that, Project M.O.R.E. moved still another time to a two story building at 440 South Park Avenue, Tucson, Arizona. We have been here ever since.

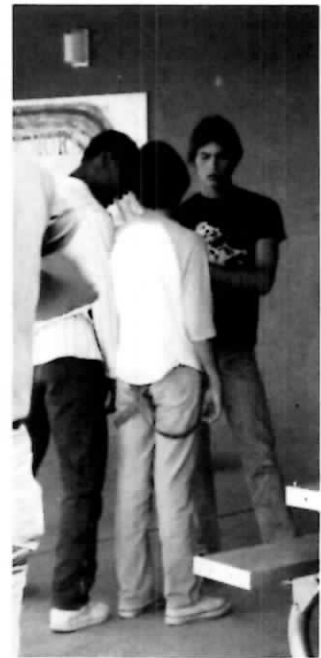

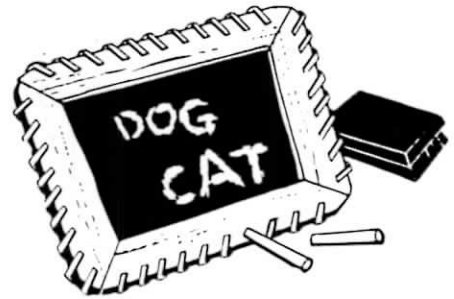
COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS
