



Froject M.B.R.f. is an Alternative Education High School in Jucson Vnified School






Brisa's Advising


Beth's Advising































Bull Rider at Project M.O.R.E. Alejandro Cancio


The TM technique is taught to new practitioners in a standardized, seven-step procedure, comprised of two introductory lectures, a personal interview, and a two-hour instruction session given on each of two consecutive days. Instruction begins with a short puja ceremony performed by the teacher, after which the student receives a mantra, learns the technique, and begins practicing. Subsequent sessions provide further clarification of correct practice, as well as more information about the TM technique.





Rock School started in 1985 when two students and I (Joe) wanted more time with music so we made up rock school. Originally we had Rock School two days a week.


The object of Rock School was to help people learn music theory and improve on their skills (drums, guitar, keyboard, and vocals); and then we gave students the opportunity to perform.

Music has changed in the last twenty years and still the guitar is the most popular to play.



Good luck to all the musicians that come to our school! I wish you the best in your music!


























ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS & Publisher's Message:
